# **Care Partners' Big Year!**

2015 was a banner year for Care Partners. We incorporated as an independent nonprofit, received our tax exempt status, developed by-laws and

policies and recruited and trained a new board of directors —all while continuing our programs and services.

Here's a few highlights:

- Marnie Hovland was hired in March as our new RN Care Coordinator.
- Over 100 people attended the programs Dr. Barclay presented on Alzheimer's and other Dementias !
- Initial funding was received to pilot a Senior Chore Program.
- Caregiver Coffee programs were started in Tofte & Grand Marais.
- A new marketing & fundraising effort resulted in a new website & brochure.
- The 7th Annual Light Up a Life Program at the East Bay raised \$1300.
- For our first annual appeal we set a goal of \$5000 and raised almost \$10,000. (Thanks everyone!)

# **Calling All Chore Volunteers!**

Interested in helping your senior neighbors with occasional chores around the house? Our goal is to help at-risk elders to stay safely in their homes when no other help is available.

Volunteers receive a short training, mileage reimbursement and choose their assignments. Activities might include short-term housekeeping, shoveling, seasonal yard work, gardening, organizing, minor home repair or household maintenance projects. What do you enjoy?

# Heidi and Ingeborg's Story

When Heidi first connected with Care Partners, it was because of an interest in geriatrics. She jumped on board the organization's second-ever training class, and immediately

began making connections that would eventually change her life.

In 2010, Heidi's mother, Ingeborg, joined her in Cook County at age 89. "It was always part of the plan for her to move in with us," Heidi reflected.

During this time, Heidi continued volunteering with Care Partners, visiting an elderly woman to give her caregivers a break. Ingeborg

would accompany her, and Heidi was delighted to see the way her client and mother connected. The two women would tell stories and laugh. "It was just the coolest thing."

When Care Partners piloted a Group Respite program, Ingeborg became a beloved member of the group. As Ingeborg's needs grew, Heidi left her full-time work to care for her. At times, she'd wake up three times a night to tend to her mother. "There came a point where I just couldn't do it anymore. I contacted Care Partners, they put a call out, and people responded. It was amazing."

Heidi noticed that each volunteer who visited with her mother had a unique impact. "They related in a different way than a family member could. It was such a break for us and for her normal routine."

Eventually, with the help of Care Partners, Ingeborg got her wish to be at home through end-of-life, which was a gift to both Heidi and her mother. Heidi expressed, "It was amazing, and it could not have happened without Care Partners."

Heidi and her mother's experience with Care Partners is similar to that of many families caring for a loved one experiencing end-of-life, aging, or serious illness. Not only does Care Partners strive to provide life-affirming care and connections for clients and care givers, but it also fosters deep relationships between clients and community volunteers.

"As a volunteer, most of us feel honored," Heidi explains. "You're invited into somebody's life, and you get as much out of the visits, if not more. It's a rich, valuable, relational experience where you get out there and make a difference."

Whether you or a loved one could benefit from additional care giving, or you'd like to make a difference as a volunteer, Care Partners hopes you'll reach out and let yourself be a part of this journey.

Volunteers are the core of Care Partners services, giving back to the elders in our community in so many ways. Each finds their niche: checking in by phone, a weekly visit at the Care Center or someone's home, recording stories, playing cards, going for a drive, relieving a caregiver, reading lessons or histories, or sitting at a hospital bed. These kindnesses mean so much, and yet most volunteers claim they receive more than they give.

Volunteers receive extensive training in safety, comfort measures, end-of-life, dementia, elder awareness, spirituality and communication.
